

Guidelines for Science Diplomacy Magazine Authors

- ❖ Articles should be written in a popular style, easily understandable by our diverse readers.
- ❖ Submission of an article implies that it has not been previously published and is not under consideration for publication elsewhere; and further, that if accepted, the same will not be published elsewhere.
- ❖ Manuscripts should be prepared in MS-Word, using double spacing, in Times New Roman, 12. The word count for manuscripts may range between 1200- 1500 words.
- ❖ Use British spellings rather than American spellings. For example, use ‘s’ in words ending in ‘-yse’; e.g., ‘analyse’, ‘paralyse’.
- ❖ References to literature must be numbered consecutively in the order of their occurrence in the text and should be placed at the end of the article. In the main text, the references should be indicated by numbers (as a superscript). The list of references at the end of the text should be in the following format:
