## Instructions to Authors [2014]

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### SCOPE

The Indian Journal of Geo Marine Sciences, issued monthly, is devoted to the publication of communications relating to various facets of research in (i) Marine sciences including marine engineering and marine pollution; (ii) Climate change & (iii) Geosciences i.e. geology, geography and geophysics. IJMS is a multidisciplinary journal in marine sciences and geosciences. Therefore, research and review papers and book reviews of general significance to marine sciences and geosciences which are written clearly and well organized will be given preference.

### NATURE OF MANUSCRIPT

General articles, review articles, opinions, correspondences, research articles, research news, news, meeting reports, historical commentaries and historical comments/notes and book reviews are the categories of manuscripts to be submitted to IJMS.

**General articles** [about 5000 words, very essential figures, tables, display items] discuss current trends in research in marine sciences and geosciences that would be of interest to readers outside the field. The articles should include an abstract, introductory paragraph, brief subheads at appropriate places, illustrations that will help a general reader and references.

**Review articles** [not exceeding 5000 words] survey and discuss the current developments in field related to marine sciences and geosciences.

**Opinion articles** [less than 800 words] present views on issues related to marine sciences and geosciences and activities related to marine sciences and geosciences.

**Correspondence** [less than 1000 words and essential display items] serves to rapidly communicate important new findings. Contributions dealing with technical advances or advances in instrumentation will be published as **Technical notes**.

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**Meeting reports** [less than 800 words] deal with highlights/technical contents of a conference/symposium/

discussion-meeting, etc. conveying readers the significance of important advances.

**Historical commentary/notes** [limited to about 2000 words] inform readers about interesting aspects of personalities or institutions of marine sciences, about watershed events in the history/development of marine sciences and geosciences

Illustrations and photographs are welcome.

### SUBMISSION OF MANUSCRIPT

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It is mandatory on the part of the corresponding author to furnish the following certificate at the time of submission of the manuscript [required to be submitted through Head of Dept/Inst on official letterhead], which may be submitted as scanned copy attachment.

*This is to certify that the reported work in the paper entitled "....." submitted for publication is an original one and has not been submitted for publication elsewhere. I/we further certify that proper citations to the previously reported work have been given and no data/table/figure has been quoted verbatim from other publications without giving due acknowledgement and without the permission of the author(s). The consent of all the authors of this paper has been obtained for submitting the paper to the "Indian Journal of Geo Marine Sciences".*

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Author (Corresponding) may provide names of two Indian and two active foreign researchers of repute along with their complete postal and email addresses, who could be the possible reviewers for the type of work presented in the article.

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**General Style:** Manuscripts should be presented as concise form as possible, and times new roman, 11 font size, typewritten in double space. The matter should be arranged in the following order: title, name(s) of author(s), department(s) and institution(s); abstract; keywords; introduction; materials and methods; results; discussion; acknowledgement; references and appendix. Tables and captions for figures should be typed on separate pages. Figures can be inserted at the end of the text, one figure per page. Figures may also be send as an attachment along with manuscript (zip file).

Symbols, units and nomenclature as recommended by the International Association for the Physical Sciences of the Ocean should be used [*The international system of units (SI) in oceanography: Unesco technical papers in marine sciences, no. 45, IAPSO Publication Scientifique no. 32.*]

Special attention should be given to the mathematical portions of the paper. Equations must have variable parameters in *italics* and the constants in roman. Superscripts, subscripts, capital and small letters as well as letters or symbols likely to be confused one for the other should be clearly distinguished.

**Title:** The title should be such as to be useful in indexing and information retrieval. If a paper forms part of a series, a subtitle indicating the aspects of the work covered in the paper should be provided. If the title is long, a short title suitable for use as running title should be supplied.

**Abstract:** The abstract, usually not exceeding 150 words should indicate the scope and significant content of the paper, highlighting the principal findings and conclusions. It should be in such a form that abstracting periodicals can use it without modification.

**Keywords:** Authors must provide 4 to 6 keywords, separated by comma and these should be chosen carefully.

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**Materials and Methods:** The nomenclature, the source of materials and the procedures should be clearly stated to enable other workers to repeat the work, if necessary. New methods should be described in sufficient detail, but if the methods are already well recognized, a mere reference to

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**Acknowledgement:** Acknowledgements should be brief and for specific assistance only.

**References:** References to literature, numbered consecutively, should be placed at the end of the paper. In the text, they should be indicated by numbers placed above the line (superior).
